The SYK model at very low energies

We explore the Sachdev-Ye-Kitaev model at large N and very low energies. A study of quadratic fluctuations around the conformal saddle reveals a replica off-diagonal mode that can acquire a negative mass-squared at exponentially low temperatures. However, at such low temperatures, the physics of the model is not conformal, but is rather described by a strongly fluctuating Schwarzian degree of freedom. The correlation functions in the Schwarzian theory are softer and we find that there is no spin-glass transition. We have also performed exact diagonalization study of the low lying spectrum of the SYK model with large system sizes up to $N=42$. There is no hint of a spin-glass phase in the spectral data. We also find that the distribution of the ground state energy is Gaussian, not Tracy-Widom.
